In addition, Sherman County School is fortunate to have been recently accepted into the highly successful Oregon Response to Instruction

and Intervention (ORTIi) project. This comprehensive program will provide targeted, effective instruction to meet the needs of all students. The focus is on literacy, early intervention, and the use of evidenced-based practices.

We are committed to pursuing excellence for each and every child in the District. The Board of Directors and the Sherman County School District staff value children and education as their highest priority and will continue to uphold our motto, "Working Together to Put Student Success First".
