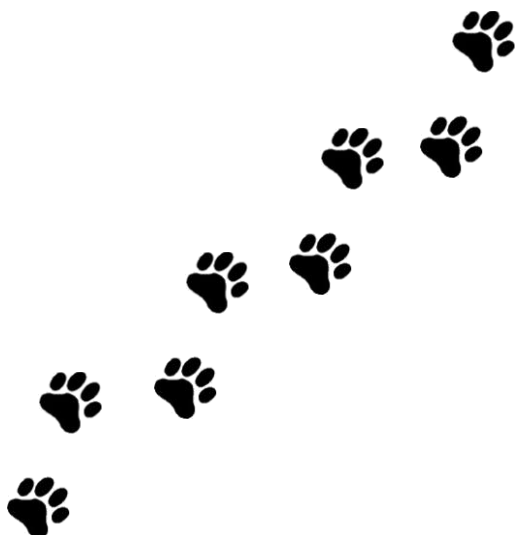


What Can You Do to Help Your Child Stay on the Path of Positive Behavior?

- Review SSR with your child.
- Ask your child about his/her day at school every day.
- Make sure your child is ready every day.
- Ensure a good night's sleep.
- Provide a quiet time and space for your child to do homework nightly.
- Keep in touch with your child's teacher.
- Encourage your child to use appropriate language and tone.
- Practice positive phrases with your child, such as, "Thank you," "Excuse me," "Please," and "I'm sorry."
- Be a visible part of your child's school day. Attend Booster/PTO meetings and other school activities as your schedule allows.

What IS Positive Behavioral Interventions & Supports (PBIS)?

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) is a school wide approach to discipline and a process for creating a safer and more effective school. PBIS is a systems approach to enhancing the capacity of our school to educate all children by developing research-based, school wide, and classroom discipline systems. The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. With PBIS, instructional time is more effectively used for teaching and the overall school environment is calm and conducive to learning.

What is SRR?

At Sherman County School our expectations fall under SRR. We consider these three words as important Life Rules:

Be Safe

Be Respectful

Be Responsible

How you can support PBIS.

1. Use the Same Rules at Home: SRR.
2. Decide What SRR Means at Home.
3. Let Your Child Know When They are SRR.
4. Help Your Child Learn How to Be SRR.
5. Ask Your Child If He/She is Being SRR.
