These findings might also include specific triggers.
- Create a transparent picture of Strategic Investment Funds and what they mean to the Sherman County School District.
 - Where we would be without the wind dollars.
 - More precise picture and evaluation of expenditure of wind dollars.
- ❖ Build trust and support healing between the Sherman County School District Board and school staff, administrators, families, residents and community leaders by acknowledging current challenges and building on strengths.
- Create authentic, good, honest relations within the school community by developing effective communication and engagement opportunities for all residents of Sherman County.
- ❖ Work in a collaborative effort with Sherman County residents to foster an outstanding environment for the success of all Sherman County students. Create a Partnership and Destination School District.
- ❖ Investigate ways to increase grant writing to support programs at the elementary and secondary level.

The Sherman County School District has maintained high quality education programs primarily because of our hard-working staff, dedicated School Board and also because our businesses, community agencies, parents and volunteers consistently support our schools.
